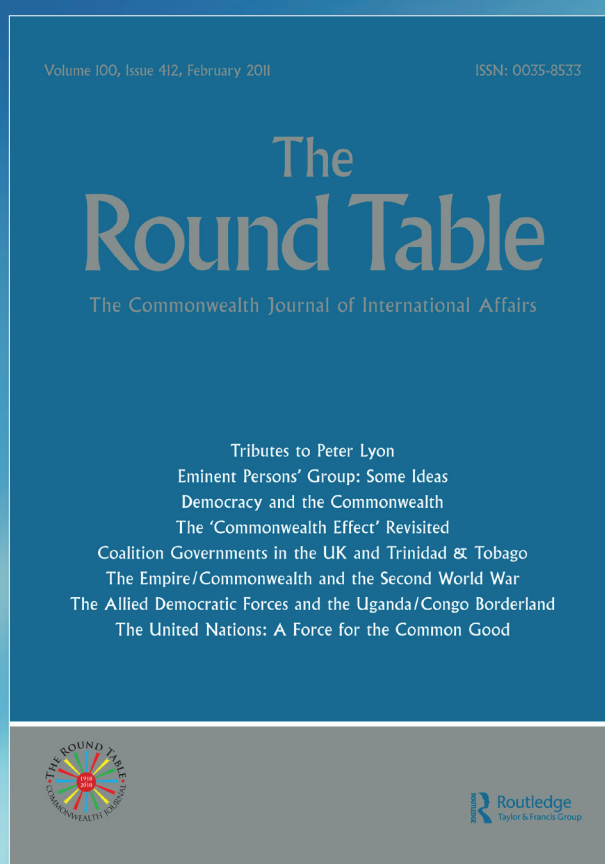


• PETER LYON • MEMORIAL PRIZE

£1,000 Annual Cash Prize announced for the best
policy-orientated article published in *The Round Table*

*This prize has been instituted by **The Round Table** in memory of the late Peter Lyon (1934-2010), who was reader in International Relations at the Institute of Commonwealth Studies, University of London, and Editor of **The Round Table** from 1983-2004*



THE PETER LYON MEMORIAL PRIZE

The prize for the winning article is the sum of £1,000 sterling. Where the winner is a resident in the UK, or another Commonwealth country in which **The Round Table** holds activities, it is hoped that the prize winner may be invited to take part (e.g. by attending a Round Table dinner).

The First Award

The first prize will be awarded in 2012, for the best policy-relevant article published in 2011. The publisher of **The Round Table**, Routledge, will publicize the winning article on the journal's website and through our promotional media. The winner will also receive a £1,000 Sterling cash award.

Topic

The prize will be awarded for the best policy-orientated article on a theme of significance for the contemporary Commonwealth that has been published in the journal each calendar year.

The prize will be awarded early in the year to the author of the best policy-relevant article published in the previous year.

Judging

The prize will be awarded at the discretion of the Editor, with advice both from the Journal's editorial and international advisory boards. The Editor's decision will be final. Applicants should retain copies of their articles, which will not normally be returned.

All articles published in the journal which contain a significant policy-orientated element will automatically be considered as entrants for the prize.
